

# News & Notices

- Last edition we told you about the restoration of David Hephher's '**Christ Over Sheffield**'. The work is complete and the painting has been hung in the prayer corner at the back of the West End, make sure you take a look.
- Our interim Assistant Director of Music, **Mr James Kealey**, is leaving the Cathedral over the summer to begin studying at the University of Rochester in America. We are enormously grateful for all James has given to the Cathedral over the last few months. We will be welcoming Mr Joshua Stephens back to the Cathedral in September as our permanent Assistant Director of Music.
- **Events for Older People:** The 2018/19 programme is now available and can be collected from the welcome desk. The film theme for the autumn programme feature ordinary people who brought about change in our society. The first film, '*Suffragette*', will be shown on Monday 24 September at 10.30 and again at 13.30. **The Pilgrim Group** recommences on Tuesday 11 September in the Town Trust Room at 11.00 beginning with coffee and a natter. In these 6 sessions we will be exploring why the Creeds were developed and the role they play in Christian life and faith.

# Roughshod: Deliver

It was a joy to welcome five young professional actors into the life of the Cathedral. Known for their high energy performances with a spiritual edge, the company were with us from Sunday 8 to Sunday 15 July. Andrew, Beth, Esther, Jared and Martha are the members of Roughshod Company and delivered a fast paced mix of theatre, comedy and insight to the world.

The team worked with the Cathedral Archer Project delivering two drama workshops for those who use the project. Comments from participants: *'Brilliant group'* *'Great fun'* *'Very entertaining'*.

The team joined the Cathedral Senior Group for a performance in the Nave: a series of short stories ranging from dramatic interpretation of parables to personal stories of faith and hope. It caused us to laugh, ponder and cry. The final play was based around the events of the crucifixion from the experience of some of the new testament characters who were there. Following the performance, the audience were able to ask questions of the team about their ministry and profession as Christian actors.

The Friday evening performance was a mix of comedy, dramatic storytelling, spoken word and the personal experience of the actors themselves. Riding Lights Roughshod delivered a show that asks: what happens when God intervenes in ordinary lives?

The team left us on Sunday 15 July with much food for thought.



# Cathedral Worship: Highlights

The spring is always a wonderful time in the Cathedral's liturgical calendar. Beginning with the celebrations at Easter, which this year were all the more special as the spotlight was on Sheffield Cathedral for our Easter morning broadcast on the BBC to millions of people around the world. The celebration showed the wonder of Cathedral worship, the excellence of our choral music and was a fantastic team effort from people across Cathedral life, both staff and volunteers.



We were also delighted to once again host a beacon event for 'Thy Kingdom Come', at Pentecost. People from across the Diocese and ecumenical church joined us at the Cathedral for a celebration with the Bishop.

On the 30 June and 1 July, we held the ordinations of 9 priests and 14 deacons, across three services. The Cathedral was filled with the family and friends of those being ordained, to celebrate this significant stage in their ministries.

We also held the funeral of renowned boxing trainer, Brendan Ingle MBE. Hundreds of people converged on the Cathedral for the televised service marking the life of a man who contributed greatly to the city.



# Building works on the Forecourt

We are making some slight adjustments to our Forecourt, to make it even more accessible to all. These works include:

- Removing the existing steps completely and re-laying new and existing paving to provide a gentle slope down to the level of the main entrance path into the Cathedral entrance.
- The existing paving stones are to be carefully taken up and re-laid.
- The installation of additional bollards and the fixing of a new handrail to the Narthex steps, alongside the Gift Shop.

The works will start on 13 August and are expected to finish on 7 September. During this time there will be metal fencing around the main work area but the Forecourt will still be accessible, as will the main entrance.

### **What is Confirmation?**

Confirmation is a special church service in which a person confirms the promises that were made when they were baptised. If you were baptised, sometimes known as a Christening, when you were a child, your parents and godparents made these promises on your behalf.

As a young person or adult, you may be ready to affirm these promises and commit your life to following Jesus Christ. At a Confirmation service, you make these promises for yourself. Your friends and family, as well as the local Christian community, will be there to promise to support and pray for you. The Bishop will lay their hands on you and ask God's Holy Spirit to give you the strength and commitment to live God's way for the rest of your life.


