## The Liturgy of the Word

#### The New Testament Reading: Revelation 5.1-10

A reading from the Revelation to John

Then I saw in the right hand of the one seated on the throne a scroll written on the inside and on the back, sealed with seven seals; and I saw a mighty angel proclaiming with a loud voice, 'Who is worthy to open the scroll and break its seals?' And no one in heaven or on earth or under the earth was able to open the scroll or to look into it. And I began to weep bitterly because no one was found worthy to open the scroll or to look into it. Then one of the elders said to me, 'Do not weep. See, the Lion of the tribe of Judah, the Root of David, has conquered, so that he can open the scroll and its seven seals.'

Then I saw between the throne and the four living creatures and among the elders a Lamb standing as if it had been slaughtered, having seven horns and seven eyes, which are the seven spirits of God sent out into all the earth. He went and took the scroll from the right hand of the one who was seated on the throne. When he had taken the scroll, the four living creatures and the twenty-four elders fell before the Lamb, each holding a harp and golden bowls full of incense, which are the prayers of the saints. They sing a new song:

'You are worthy to take the scroll and to open its seals, for you were slaughtered and by your blood you ransomed for God saints from every tribe and language and people and nation; you have made them to be a kingdom and priests serving our God, and they will reign on earth.'

It is strongly advised that communicants do not dip their wafers into the cup in order to receive from it (the method known as intinction). The possibility of spreading infection is much greater if this method is used.

If you do not wish to receive Holy Communion, you are invited to come forward for a blessing. If you wish to receive a blessing, please bring this booklet with you and hold it so that it can be clearly seen by the ministers.

**Threads through Creation** is a spectacular sequence of twelve huge textile panels. It's an exuberant retelling of the creation story in the book of Genesis, a retelling which many visitors will find both moving and breath-taking. Viewers are treated to a wonderful variety of colours, shapes, patterns – and of course lots of creatures!

The exhibition is one of the largest textile projects by a single artist, ever. It has taken Jacqui nearly three years. It follows on from 'Threads through Revelation', her first huge exhibition which visited 14 cathedrals from 2016 to 2018 and was seen by more than 500,000 visitors.

Threads through Creation is touring cathedrals throughout 2023 and 2024. If your school or community group would like to visit there is a free teacher PDF guide on our website (<a href="www.sheffieldcathedral.org">www.sheffieldcathedral.org</a>) and our guides will be on hand to give walking tours throughout the exhibition. There will also be craft activities to engage little ones in their learning about God's creations.

For those who would like to reflect on the biblical, theological, and artistic content of the tapestries with some guidance, our Minor Canon Theologian Casey Strine will be leading three 'theological tours' of Threads through Creation. The tours will happen on:

Friday 26 January, 13.00 to 14.00 PM (following the 12.30 Eucharist) Friday 9 February, 10.30 to 11.30 Tuesday 20 February, 18.30 to 19.30 (after Evensong)

These are free, and you need not sign up. Consider bringing along a friend or colleague who does not normally attend the Cathedral (or church at all) but might enjoy this sort of intellectual and artistic discussion.
